Key Numbers from 2021 survey of NE businesses

69%

of respondents reported that they had heard of the Circular Economy concept (up from 59% in 2019, 32% in 2018) 65%

are 'extremely' to 'moderately' confident in being able to apply CE principles to their business (58% in 2019) 63%

believe they are adopting one or more of the CE principles in their business (62% in 2019) 50%

listed 'cost savings' as a driver for adopting CE principles (56% in 2019)

of respondents reported that achieving net zero is 'extremely' to 'moderately' important to their business 94%

think CE initiatives are 'moderately' to 'extremely' important to achieving net zero 94%



Awareness of Circular Economy more than doubled since 2018

Significant increase in awareness levels between 2018 and 2021 (up from 32% to 69%)

Have you heard of the Circular Economy concept previously?





Businesses most likely to think of Circular Economy as reuse or recycling.

• The majority of businesses that were aware of the Circular Economy concept thought that it covered 'reusing', 'recycling', 'sustainable procurement', 'redesigning', and 'considering the full supply chain'.

What do you generally consider the Circular Economy to cover?






More businesses confident in applying Circular Economy concept

• The latest evaluation survey shows an improvement in confidence of application. 11% of businesses were 'extremely' confident and 20% were 'very' confident. This combined 31% compares to 14% in 2019.






Businesses aware of CE: 35 in 2018, 52 in 2019 & 54 in 2021



Flatter levels of businesses actually adopting CE principles

- All respondents were given a definition of Circular Economy and were asked based on this definition whether they were adopting any of the principles in their business already.
- Over 6 in 10 businesses are adopting one or more of the CE principles.






Number of businesses responding: 112 in 2018, 93 in 2019 & 78 in 2021.



Recycling is the most common principle adopted by businesses

Businesses are already applying some of the key Circular Economy principles:


- Almost 9 out of 10 (88%) currently recycle, with 63% reusing materials.
- Only 6% of business are not currently applying any of the principles in their business.






Businesses keen on more CE advice, funding & information

- 62% of businesses would benefit from advice on how to implement CE principles
- Around half need support identifying sources of funding (54%) and more information on CE (51%)

Businesses think CE is extremely/very important to achieving net zero




- 53% of businesses have committed to achieving net zero
- 27% have set deadlines to achieve (or have already achieved) net zero

How important do you think Circular Economy initiatives are to achieving net zero?





Cost savings are a key driver in driving CE adoption


What were the main drivers which led to you adopting the Circular Economy concepts identified in the previous question?





CV-19 is having a mixed impact on CE activity


Has Covid-19 had an impact on your organisation's Circular Economy activity?
